EYFS

We have been so busy since the last newsletter. We have continued to work really hard on our phonics, learning many new sounds and recognising these in our reading. We have read a story called Goldilocks and the three bears and had a go at retelling them through acting and role play. In maths we have looked at recognising and identifying the numbers 3 and 4. Here we have used and developed the skill of recognising and using these around the classroom. In other areas we have worked on art and PSHE skills, using the story as a base for our learning.

<u>Class</u>

We have had a busy few weeks and have produced some amazing work. In English, we have started our new book called The Fantastic Flying Books of Mr Morris. Through this, we

have worked on developing our reading and grammar skills and using these in short pieces of writing. Some of us are looking at traditional stories and developing our early writing skills. In maths we have worked on our skills in ordering and comparing numbers and multiplication and division skills.

Here, further developing our understanding of problem solving and reasoning. In the foundation subjects, we have started looking at designing and making our own soft toy and in science, looking at ourselves and other animals in science.

When the children are at St Cuthbert's on a Friday you can email adminfe@uppernidderdalefed.school or phone St Cuthbert's on 01423 711407.


Where possible please try to ensure you have passed on information and messages at morning drop off, or via email first thing, but we understand that sometimes unavoidable things crop up during the day.


