Class 1

Nursery and Reception children have been enjoying time in the outdoor area. They had a visit from the Eco Team to help them plant! Year One have been busy conducting static electricity experiments!

Class 2

Class 2 have had a superb start back to the new term. We have been busy writing recounts about our Federation Friday and learning about how to find fractions of amounts. We have particularly enjoyed thinking about how we can conduct a fair test in our new electricity topic in Science when observing the effects of static electricity.

Class 3

We've had a really busy first couple of weeks back in class after the Easter break. In English, we have started to look at our new text and have been building our skills up to write a balanced argument around the use of screen time and the influences on children. Within English, we are developing our use of punctuation, adjectives and sentence structure. In maths we are working on a variety of areas including arithmetic and angles, whilst year 6 are preparing well for their tests in a couple of weeks. We are also working really hard on our times tables and arithmetic skills and developing our speed with these. In the afternoons we have covered some amazing work in art looking at photography and building up a collage. We have also covered a lot of work on circuits in science.

Keeping Safe

This week we have had fire drills at all three of our schools. The children were excellent at all our drills, they know how to keep themselves safe and others and how to conduct themselves safely during a drill.

Next week we will be doing our lockdown practices at all our schools. The children have been part of these practices before as we practice termly to ensure that we all remember what to do in these circumstances.

Parent Survey

We would particularly like to share the following feedback and comments:

'Spotlight on the Curriculum' sessions for parents were very highly praised. These sessions are an opportunity for parents to see the curriculum areas in action, following a presentation by the subject leaders, and to see what children do in classes. Parents valued these highly as often when children are asked what they did at school during the day, the response was "nothing"!! The next session for this half term will have a focus on PSHE and Science. Look out for more information on this shortly.

Parent Information Sessions are now held three times a year to allow more opportunity for parents/carers to have a formal discussion with the class teacher about children's progress. There is a requirement for schools to hold one parent information session per year, but we feel that it is extremely important for you to have regular opportunities to discuss your child's progress. The final session for the year will coincide with the issue of the annual school reports, and will be an opportunity for you to discuss them.

Variety/number of extra-curricular clubs – as you all know, we are always looking at how we can improve to ensure that our pupils are receiving the very best experiences and education, do following your comments, we are looking at the following for September:

Additional clubs for all age groups. Our staff run most of our clubs voluntarily. In order to offer more clubs, as suggested, **we would be grateful if you could let us know if you would be willing to volunteer to run a club yourself** (a couple of parents have already come forward ©).

Homework expectations – Every family has a different view on this, although we have had some extremely positive comments on the current homework format; in particular, the reading/phonics/times-tables daily homework that runs alongside the children's project work. We will continue to seek parent's views on this and review it accordingly.

School development progress – At this time of year, we review our progress and look towards the next academic year. All staff are involved in this process. We will be scheduling a similar session for parents/carers to attend during the final half term of this school year. Details will be shared with you later this half term.

Based at St Cuthbert's Primary, Pateley Bridge


We welcome children from the age of 3 and we are an Early Entitlement registered setting (15-30 hours funding depending on your circumstances).
