This Half Term our CHAMPS Value is:

Perseverance:

persistence in doing something despite difficulty or delay in achieving success:

By practicing perseverance, the children are trying their best to overcome challenges and succeed.

EYFS

We have been so busy this week and have enjoyed all our learning. We have continued to learn our new phonics sounds and using these skills in our reading. We have used the story of Jack and the Beanstalk to help us retell a story and also used it to develop our understanding of planting seeds. In maths we have looked at recognising and identifying the numbers between 10 and 12 learning how to make them and also sequence these numbers. In Re we have looked at different places of worship and in PSHE, we have looked at what makes a good friend.

Class

We've had a really busy first couple of weeks back in class after the Easter break. In English, we have started to look at our new text and have been building our skills up to write a balanced argument around the use of screen time and the influences on children. In key stage one, we are looking a piece of persusive text around an adventure park. Within English, we are developing our use of punctuation, adjectives and sentence structure. In maths we are working on a variety of areas including arithmetic and angles, whilst year 6 are preparing well for their tests in a couple of weeks. We are also working really hard on our times tables and arithmetic skills and developing our speed with these. In the afternoons we have covered some amazing work in art looking at photography and building up a collage. We have also covered a lot of work on circuits in science.

Article of the Week - Article 20

Article 20 (children unable to live with their family) If a child cannot be looked after by their immediate family, the government must give them special protection and assistance. This includes making sure the child is provided with alternative care that is continuous and respects the child's culture, language and religion.

Christian Values
