Safeguarding/Support

As you know, teaching our children about online safety is of the utmost importance. Schools have a dual responsibility when it comes to online safety: to ensure that the school's online procedures keep children and young people safe, and to teach them about online safety, in and outside of school. This includes a robust filtering system that stops harmful content getting through. We also carefully monitor what content is searched for. We foster an open environment in which children and young people are encouraged to ask any questions and participate in an ongoing conversation about the benefits and dangers of the online world. Children are taught about online relationships and internet harm in PSHE.
