Class 1

What a wonderful first week! Reception have been reading 'What the ladybird heard'. They have made some amazing maps and WANTED posters to try and find Hefty Hugh and Lanky Len.

Year 1 have been learning about 'place value' in Maths. They have also been investigating materials and learning how they are made. I wonder if they can tell you at home?

Class 2

We have started work on our persuasive letter based on the text. The Day the Crayons Quit, learning all about how to use verbs, command sentences and pronouns. In maths, we have been working on multiplication using repeated addition, creating equal groups and fact families in Y2, and multiplying 2-digit numbers by 1-digit numbers in Y3. We have started our unit on Rocks for science, with experiments using melted chocolate and honeycomb to see how igneous rocks like obsidian and pumice are formed.

Class 3

This week, we have started looking at persuasive writing. To get over those rainy days, we are writing holiday brochures! We looked at lots of examples this week of effective brochures in some very sunny places. In maths, we have been tackling fractions, learning all about equivalence and simplifying.

We have also enjoyed learning about different clothes in French. Ask your child at home to see if they can remember!
