EYFS

We have been so busy this week and have enjoyed all our learning. We have continued to learn our new phonics sounds and using these skills in our reading. We have explored places around the world including Paris and China, here looking at famous landmarks and foods that they eat. In maths we have looked at recognising and identifying the numbers to 10 and have used cubes to add one and two to that number. We have also built landmarks from these cities using straws and other materials and looked how we can keep safe at home and at school.

We've had another busy couple of weeks in school. In English, we have started to look at our new story called Thornhill written by Pam Smy. 
