<u>EYFS</u>

We have been so busy this week and have enjoyed all our learning. We have continued to learn our new phonics sounds and using these skills in our reading. We have started to explore what London is like and comparing this to Pateley Bridge. In maths, we have looked at recognising and identifying the numbers to 10, ordering these and finding number bonds to make 10. Here we have used different materials to make, build and represent these around the classroom. We have also looked at the Easter story in RE and the work of paramedics in PSHE.

<u>Class</u>

We have had another amazing week in school. In English, have written some very pervasive letters inviting an author into school to help to promote writing. We have used some really powerful language and these are really persuasive. We look forward to sharing those with you soon. In maths, we continued to work hard on a variety of areas. Some of us are working on area and perimeter and others are working on measures including converting units of measure. We have also worked really hard on our times tables and arithmetic skills and developing our speed with these.

In the afternoons, we have started our work in history looking at the Romans and what Britain was like during Roman times. Key stage 1 are looking at significant people, we have chosen Sarah Forbes Bonetta, an African orphan who became very close to Queen Victoria. In design technology, we have started looking at bridges and windmills. Year 5 and 6 have had a great opportunity to take part in a workshop looking at Anne Frank which introduced them to Anne's life as a young Jewish girl during the Holocaust and her work, as a way of understanding prejudice historically and today.

No matter how young your child is, if they are using a device that has the internet- it is important to talk to them about people who contact them online.

We understand that you can't always be there with them, although if they are 11 and under, CEOP (The Child Exploitation and Online Protection Centre) would always recommend that their device is used in a public space, making it all the more important that your child knows that they can come to you if someone online says or does something that makes them uncomfortable, worried or upset.
