Message from the Headteacher

Another busy few weeks at Glasshouses. As we head into our winter term, there are lots of lovely events being planned in our school; the first being our Harvest festival coming up on 19 Oct. There will be the Christmas performances too - all the information will be sent to you soon. Our PTFA have been busy planning lots of fundraising events too - please keep a look out for the information and dates. Plans are afoot as that saying goes!

I wanted to share some great things that have been happening in our school over the past few weeks.

You may be aware that last week, we had our Autumn term safeguarding review from the Local Authority (every school in the authority has a review this term), which involved talking to children, staff and governors and exploring the school site. The review is a whole day of observations and discussions.

The **S** knowledge in CHAMP**S** came through very strongly and the day was very positive, with the review noting that the safeguarding practices at our school are excellent. The children were able to articulate how they are taught about safety, both on and offline. Throughout the whole day, the children (and adults (**)) were amazing and could talk about their school with pride.

Lots of things make me proud as the Headteacher of Glasshouses School, but to see the children in action in meeting such as this, really brings home how our vision and values are lived out in everything we do.

We held our Open Days at Glasshouses on Monday and Tuesday. As part of the sessions, the House Captains helped with the tour of the school. This involved showing the parents and children the classes and lessons taking place at the time. They were very confident and really 'did me proud'. The children in the other classes also greeted the parents and explained what they were doing in classes. Again, this was done in a very confident manner. They were all CHAMPS.

As you know we enjoyed our Federation Friday last week. It was great to see the children from St Cuthbert's and Glasshouses enjoying activities together - creating artwork, preparing food with 'Phunky Foods', learning about First Aid, and enjoying the outdoors at Bewerley Park and Brimham Rocks.

The year 4,5 and 6 children took part in an 'Active Morning' session at Nidderdale High School. They joined St Cuthbert's children for this event. This was the first of such sessions to be held at the High School, which have been designed to help with the transition to secondary school for our children. I received a phone call from the High School today to say that the children were all very respectful and that behaviour was great. I know they are CHAMPS, but it is great to hear this from somebody else who is not part of our school. That made my day!

I could write an essay about our fabulous children and what a great school Glasshouses is, but I am sure you want to read the rest of the news from our classes.
