We also welcomed our new families to Nursery and Years 2, 4 and 5.

The children from each school took part in the first Federation Friday day for this academic year. It is wonderful to see the children working together from across the Federation on these days.

The Federation enjoyed a day at the Nidderdale Show for the first time. It was great to be part of the community and represent our Federation. Thank you to those parents who helped to make this a success - and get up early on a Sunday to help transport the display boards!

We welcomed prospective families to our schools during the Open Day sessions. Our children were true CHAMPS and helped show the families around explaining why our school is a great place to be. We enjoyed our Harvest Service last week. It was lovely to see so many families there and so many donations to the foodbank.

The children started the sessions with Commando Jo through our Resilience curriculum; they have been learning about the growth mindset character Romeo Resilience and how this can be transferred to various situations in school.

Emerald Class

Emerald class have been enjoying looking at our second book in English lessons called 'The Lost Thing.' They have been making predictions and have begun to look at the structure of the story discussing the people, places, problem, panic and peace. In Maths we have used our knowledge of place value to begin adding and subtracting. We are really impressed with how confident they are with adding any 4 or 5 digit numbers. We will next be moving on to multiplication and if your child could continue to work on Times Tables Rockstars at home that would be really helpful. In Art, we've been exploring South American Art. We analysed South American art and discussed what techniques were used and what we liked and disliked. We used different materials to make our own painting tools and evaluated them.
