#### **Jade Class**

As you are now aware, Miss Sullivan began her maternity leave earlier than planned, due to the premature arrival of baby Raffael (5 weeks early!). Mrs Leyland will be covering the class whilst Miss Sullivan is away, having spent 4 weeks in class with the children, before Christmas, as part of the planned transition.



In Jade Class, we have had a super week exploring the story of Lost and Found, and have made our own penguin fact books; describing what penguins eat, what their features are and where they live. They have also been finding out about how teddy bears have changed over time and have really enjoyed listening to some stories about traditional toys. In PE they did gymnastics, showing off some super balancing skills and working together - really demonstrating our CHAMPS values. Well done guys!

#### **Amethyst Class**



In Amethyst Class, Year 2 have been looking at multiplying and dividing by 2 this week. In Year 3, we have been multiplying and dividing by 4.

Everyone has been thinking about our CHAMPS value of achievement. We have been writing about what we want to achieve as a class and what we want to achieve for ourselves.

In English, we have been learning to punctuate speech using inverted commas (we used to call them speech marks!). We are now using this knowledge about writing dialogue to make our story writing more interesting to read.

#### **Obsidian Class**

Obsidian Class has been working incredibly hard over the past few weeks.

The children have written some adventure stories based upon the picture book, Journey, by Aaron Becker. In our stories, the characters discover a magic pen and use this to create whatever they want.
