We have been extremely busy in Diamond Class- Including welcoming a new friend to our class which has been just lovely! We have welcomed Oscar with our beautiful CHAMPS value of manners!

We have been focusing on our geography question 'Would you rather live somewhere hot or somewhere cold?' We have been enjoying singing the continents song learning all about the seven different continents, as well as the equator. We have even been investigating the climate globally and local weather.

In English we have finished our wonderful stickman stories, as well as writing book reviews to explore our favorite parts of the story.

Our provision for early years is looking brilliant with all things continents and countries including collage globe making!



Ruby Class

With the Spring term well underway, we are seeing super learning behaviours and positive attitudes to learning in Ruby Class, with everyone really trying to embrace our CHAMPS Values. We have certainly taken on board the Manners Value and the politeness of the children brings a smile to all the adults each day.

We have a new text that we are currently exploring in English sessions, The Owl who was afraid of the dark by Jill Tomlinson. The children are collecting synonyms to extend their vocabulary choices and add interest for the reader. In Maths we are learning all about fractions of shapes and amounts. We all know that fractions must 'be equal parts' - so be careful when you share chocolate or pizza We have a roaming reporter in Ruby Class, who goes home with the children. They enjoy various activities in and around the locality and the children write about their adventures. When the Everywhere Bear arrives at your house we hope you have fun!

Finally, a big welcome to Flynn, who has joined us, we are so pleased to have you as part of our Ruby Team.



Emerald Class

In Emerald class we have been busy writing our diary entries based on the text 'The Matchbox Diary.' We have really enjoyed using lots of different grammatical features to show off in our writing. We have parenthesis, semi colon, direct speech and fronted adverbials. They are going to be an impressive piece of writing.

In Maths, we have continued our learning about fractions and can now add, subtract, multiply and divide using them.

In science we have been looking at different types of rock and enjoyed making honeycomb to mimic how igneous rock is formed. Year 5 and 6 have enjoyed learning about the properties of materials and have investigated if they are conductors or not. We also carried out an investigation to find out if different solutes would dissolve.

Finally, welcome to Harry who has joined us in Year 6. He is a great addition to our class.
