## **Attendance News**

You will already be aware that we promote good attendance at school. We shared some of the negative effects on pupils that do not regularly attend school in the last Attendance Newsletter.

From the 19<sup>th</sup> August 2024, all schools must follow the new DfE statutory guidance about improving attendance.

Some of the important changes that will affect parents are;

- The national threshold for a school to consider issuing a penalty notice to parents will be 10 session (a session is half a day) within a period of 10 school weeks.
- The first penalty notice will be £80 if paid within 21 days, or £160 within 28 day.
- If a second penalty notice is issued to the same parent in respect of the same pupil, the parent must pay £160 in 28 days.
- Holidays are not listed as a reason to take time off in term times. Under the new guidance this would be considered an unauthorised absence.
