SAFEGUARDING NEWS

What is a Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL)?

It is a statutory requirement that each school has an appropriate senior member of staff to take lead responsibility for safeguarding and child protection. We all have a responsibility to keep children safe but DSL's have additional responsibilities in ensuring the safety and wellbeing of our children.

We have a strong team of DSL's within the Federation that are led by Mrs Wilkinson. Miss Thornber, Mr Caswell, Mrs Haneskog, Mrs Fearnley, Mrs Thomas, Miss Newton, and Mrs Lumley are all deputy DSLs.

Key aspects of the Designated Safeguarding Lead role include:

- Ensuring that all staff are aware of the process for raising safeguarding concerns
- > Ensuring that all staff understand the signs of child abuse and neglect
- > Referring any concerns to Social Care
- Monitoring the children who are the subject of Child Protection and CiN (Child in Need) Plans
- > Maintaining accurate and secure child protection records
- Raising awareness of the school's safeguarding policies and procedures, and ensuring that these are implemented and reviewed regularly
