## Safeguarding



There have been some really alarming findings from a recent Ofcom report\*, about parents setting up social media accounts for their children aged under 12. The report found that 58% of parents have set up social media accounts for their children - the top five most popular being: YouTube (33%), TikTok (18%), WhatsApp (17%), Snapchat (14%) and Facebook (9%). It's worth noting that on 11th April 2024, Th The minimum recommended age for WhatsApp is 16 years of age. The minimum recommended age for using YouTube

unsupervised is 18 years of age. The minimum recommended age for using Tik Tok is 13

years of age. The minimum recommended age for using Snapchat is 13 years of age.

The minimum recommended age for suing Facebook is 13 years of age.
