#### Class 1

Reception have been learning about 2d and 3d shapes. They have been spotting them within our classroom and outdoor area and learning to use specific mathematical language to describe them.

In year 1, we have been finalising our work on magnets and forces. They have also started a new unit on money and recognising coins, notes and counting quantities.

#### Class 3

Class 3 has been busy in the last few weeks. We have been writing actionadventure stories using the book Cosmic.

All of class 3 also competed in a fantastic football tournament and everyone gave a fantastic effort and got stuck in! Well done to Team 1 who came 2<sup>nd</sup> in the tournament!

#### Class 2

In maths, we have moved onto looking at mass. We have practised using the four operations when problems solving with mass.
