Jade class has been extremely busy over this half term.

English: We have been looking at the story of 'Iris and Isaac' and are in the middle of writing our own books based on this story.

Reception have also started reading books in and outside of school, which is a fantastic achievement!

Maths: Jade class has been busy learning about 2D and 3D shapes and Reception went on lots of shape hunts to see what they could find inside and outside the classroom!

Year 1 are also mastering their addition and subtraction within 20 by using number bonds (feel free to test these skills at home!!) Reception have started looking at number bonds to 5 and I am very impressed with what they have achieved so far \odot

In PHSE we have been looking at healthy eating and how to look after ourselves as well as our teeth. The children loved to share their daily routines on how they get themselves ready in the morning and brush their teeth.

Geography has been exciting for us all as we looked at how our natural world is so wonderful! We have looked at the continents and oceans, as well as our local area.

Amethyst Class have had a very busy half term.

In English we have been learning to write to inform. We have written leaflets about what schools were like in the past (recapping our History knowledge).

We have also written a set of instructions for someone to follow. We had to bake buns to make sure the instructions made sense! The buns looked and tasted great, so the instructions worked.

In Maths we have been learning about multiplication and division. We have used pictures and concrete objects to support this. We are getting really good at our times tables. In Year 2 we are learning our 2, 5 and 10 times tables. In Year 3 we are learning our 3 and 4 times tables.

What an amazing couple of months Obsidian have had!

In English, we have focused on non-fiction texts, including Instructions and Explanation texts. We wrote instructions on how to create a memory box and then also, how to create our favourite recipes! We applied our knowledge of imperatives, time conjunctions and parenthesis. We then continued by writing detailed explanations of how the digestive system and circulatory system works.

In maths, we have focused on the strategies for column addition and subtraction. We have mastered the formal method for adding up to 7 digit numbers. We then applied this to problem solving including, perimeter.

In Geography, Year 5 and 6 have been learning all about population. We have studied how population has changed over time, looking at countries with population growth and population decline. We have used maps, graphs and census data to support our learning of human geography.

Year 3 and 4 have been answering the big question, why are rainforests important? We have look at the features of rainforests, including the 4 layers. We have used apps to locate rainforest and studied the impact of deforestation and what the consequences could be.

We also have lots of wonderful Christmas activities happening. The children were fabulous representatives at the Christmas Fair, showing their entrepreneurialism. Well done to all the children who made the stalls.

Online Leaders

The Online Leaders have been promoting online safety to everyone and letting people know what to do if they see something online that upsets them. We have also been busy making sure that the laptops and equipment are looked after.

Attendance News

Term time holiday absences

The cost of a holiday and tickets has increased significantly over recent years. Whilst we appreciate that this is one of the main reasons parents take their children out of school for term time holidays, there are some things we would like you to consider:

Impact on performance and mental health:

Absences from school cause gaps in children's knowledge and understanding. As children progress through school they build on their existing knowledge, however children who have gaps struggle to grasp next steps. As well as the negative impact this has on progress, this can also cause children to lack confidence and suffer from low self-esteem.

Penalty Notice

One week of term time holiday amounts to ten unauthorised sessions. This means that school has to notify the local authority for them to issue a penalty notice or fine.

School Attendance this year

Attendance is tracked by the government and this is compared to our school attendance data. Currently Glasshouses School attendance is above the expected standard.




Community Give Back
