We have been busy this term continuing our Little Wandle phonics – learning new sounds in EYFS and different ways of spelling in Year 1. We have had lots of fun predicting our new text of Iris and Isaac, talking about Arctic animals, polar regions and the Northern Lights.

In Geography, we have been locating continents, oceans and locating the equator. We have learned the difference between climate and weather and talking about the continents closest to the equator and comparing them from those far away.

In Maths we have been learning names of 2D and 3D shapes, identifying and classifying them into groups. We have then moved onto whole numbers and part numbers and talking about addition, solving problems practically.

As we move closer in to December we are beginning to sing our new Nativity songs, learn about the meaning of Christmas and why Christians celebrate Christmas. We look forward to showing you our final performance of the Nativity at the end of the term.








## **Ruby Class**

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As the weather turns colder and the festive season draws near, the children have been busier than ever, working hard in their lessons and taking part in exciting activities. The shorter days and chilly mornings haven't slowed them down; their enthusiasm and energy have shone brightly throughout this term!

In Maths, we've been focusing on the building blocks of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. The children have shown great progress in developing their skills and applying them to solve tricky problems. In English, they've been learning how to write reports, focusing on schools in the past. They've used subheadings to organise their ideas and crafted thoughtful paragraphs. It's been lovely to see how this work has tied in with their History lessons, where they've explored how school life has changed over time.

Outdoor education has been another highlight of the term. The children especially enjoyed creating mud figures of wild animals: hedgehogs, foxes, and other creatures. Although things got a little messy, the results were fantastic, and the children loved showing off their creations!

This term has been a wonderful mix of hard work and fun. I am so proud of everything the children have achieved. Wishing you all a happy and peaceful Christmas!

### **Emerald Class**

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We have been very busy in Emerald Class. In English we have been writing instructions to show how to make a memory box. They have produced some wonderful pieces of work and they are showcased in the hall on our writing wall.

In Maths we have completed our unit about multiplication and division. We have played lots of games to help us remember our times tables and we can see the progress that the children are making.

The children have loved our Science lessons and finding out about how to look after your teeth. Ask them what happened to the eggs after we out them in a selection of different liquids. The children in Year 5 and 6 have been learning about the heart and how important it is and how to look after it.

I was so proud of our eldest children when they represented our federation at the cenotaph on Remembrance Day. They have really enjoyed learning about WW2 and you could see how reflective our children are as they paid their respects.

It was wonderful to take the children in Year 5 and 6 swimming the other week and to see the progress they have made in their lessons. I have heard some wonderful stories about the children in Year 3 and 4 on their residential. We are so proud of everything that they achieved.







### **Attendance News**

#### Term time holiday absences

The cost of a holiday and tickets has increased significantly over recent years. Whilst we appreciate that this is one of the main reason's parents take their children out of school for term time holidays, there are some things we would like you to consider:

#### Impact on performance and mental health:

Absences from school cause gaps in children's knowledge and understanding. As children progress through school they build on their existing knowledge, however children who have gaps struggle to grasp next steps. As well as the negative impact this has on progress, this can also cause children to lack confidence and suffer from low self-esteem, stress and anxiety.

#### **Penalty Notice**

One week of term time holiday amounts to ten unauthorised sessions. This means that school would have to notify the local authority for them to issue a penalty notice or fine.

#### **School Attendance this year**

School attendance is tracked by the government and this is compared to our school attendance.

Currently St. Cuthbert's attendance is well below the expected standard.



#### **Extra-Curricular Clubs**

Next term we are running a Music Band Club on a Tuesday after school for KS2, Chess Club on a Wednesday morning before school for KS2, and Kanga Sports Club on a Friday morning for both KS1 & KS2.

After Christmas Mr Wilkinson will be starting a Ukulele Club – see separate letters sent home.



## **Community Give Back**

A massive shout out to the Nidderdale National Landscape Waller's association for making repairs to our school field! This was helped by Andrew Weatherhead who also kindly donated stone from his side of the wall to help fill the gaps. The ground has been too wet for them to complete the work doing but they have promised to return in the spring.


#### **Wellbeing & Happiness Team**
