Welcome to the Spring Term – hopefully no more snow! After a cold start, we welcomed all the children back in the second week - eager to share their news and begin a new learning journey. The Early Years children are learning about vehicles past and present and have had great fun in the role play area railway carriage! We have travelled to destinations including Whitby and Paris! The children enjoyed learning about how a steam train works and have had great fun constructing their own railway tracks. In the construction area, they have been following instructions to build all sorts of vehicles.

In Year 1 and 2 the children are learning about the history of flight and have had fun watching man's first attempts at flying! They decided they wouldn't like to have travelled in the first aeroplanes! Year 1 have also been busy writing instructions to build an egg box helicopter and then following them.

In Maths the Early years children have been learning about numbers up to 10 and using their counting skills outdoors to record scores (aiming balls into tyres). Year 1 have been counting in 2's – socks, gloves, shoes, -all sorts of pairs! We are learning about division as sharing and odd and even numbers.

In Art, Year 1 and 2 have been looking at the pottery designs of Clarice Cliff and creating their own designs in her style. We have had some wonderful patterns! In Early years children have been drawing, box modelling and painting vehicles.










## **Ruby Class**

In Maths we have been learning about decimals and percentages, including finding out some of the history behind them.


In English we have been writing an explanation text to explain what it is to be a Champ. It has been lovely to hear the children communicating so clearly their understanding of our school values.


We would like to welcome Callie to our class, who started last week. She is such a Champ and we are pleased with how she has settled in.

#### **Mobile Phones and Devices Policy**

We now have a Mobile Phone & Devices Policy. You can see the whole policy on our website <a href="https://uppernidderdalefed.school">https://uppernidderdalefed.school</a> but below is some information from the policy.

### Use of mobile phones by parents/carers, volunteers and visitors

Parents/carers, visitors and volunteers (including governors and contractors) must adhere to this policy as it relates to staff if they are on the school site during the school day.

This means:

- Not taking pictures or recordings of pupils at school events school will post on social media as they have consents and known consents
- Not using phones in lessons, or when working with pupils

Parents/carers, visitors and volunteers will be informed of the rules for mobile phone use when they sign in at reception or attend a public event at school.

Parents/carers or volunteers supervising school trips or residential visits must not:

- Use their phone to contact other parents/carers
- Take photos or recordings of pupils, their work, or anything else which could identify a pupil

Parents/carers or volunteers supervising trips are also responsible for enforcing the School's policy for pupils using their phones, as set out in section 5 above, but must refer any sanctions to a member of staff, as they do not have the power to search or confiscate devices.

Parents/carers must use the school office as the first point of contact if they need to get in touch with their child during the school day. They must not try to contact their child on their personal mobile during the school day.

## **Behaviour Focus**

We have updated our Behaviour Policy over the recent weeks and spent our re-scheduled staff training session going through this and expectations. ### Aims of the policy

- Set **HIGH EXPECTATIONS, HIGH CHALLENGE, CLEAR BOUNDARIES APPLIED CONSISTENTLY WITH NURTURE**
- To create a culture of exceptionally good behaviour: for learning, for community, for life
- To create a restorative, 'done with' culture
- To ensure that all learners are treated fairly, shown respect and to promote good relationships
- To refuse to give learners attention and importance for poor conduct (praise in public, correct in private)
- To help learners take control over their behaviour and be responsible for the consequences of it
- To build a community which values kindness, bravery, being in charge of yourself (and your actions), gratitude, curiosity and being on the team being a **CHAMP**
- To promote community cohesion through improved relationships Koinonia
- To ensure that excellent behaviour is a minimum expectation for all
- To ensure that those with special needs or disabilities have a right to be treated with dignity and as far as possible, independence and to play an active role in the community

### **Behaviour for Learning and Life**

The phrase 'behaviour for learning' conceptualises the following three relationships experienced by a pupil:

- Their relationship with themselves, e.g. their self-confidence as a learner
- Their relationship with others, e.g. how they socially interact and recognise emotions
- Their relationship with the curriculum and learning, e.g. how best they learn

In order to foster a positive learning environment, these relationships must be developed and supported holistically.

As a universal offer, we have developed a 'Behaviour Curriculum.' Through this curriculum children are taught how to follow our behaviour policy in the same way that they are taught in any curriculum subject. Good behaviour is modelled and taught, then recapped and revisited throughout the year.

#### **Jewellery in PE**

Following North Yorkshire H&S advice, as a federation we have adopted their new Code of Practice for Jewellery in PE. No pupils or adults are permitted to wear jewellery or watches during PE sessions/Swimming lessons and will be asked to remove them including earrings.

To help with this matter if you can ensure that your child comes to school on their PE day without wearing any jewellery or earrings.

Sports leaders will be creating a booklet of games so that EYFS can work with the sports leaders to help them. They will also be asking the children what playtime games they would like.




### **Wellbeing & Happiness Team**
