

Attendance is felt to be SO important that OFSTED are now focussing on it as one of their areas of assessment.

But it also The Law Children of compulsory school age must, by law, receive a full time education. Each person with day-to-day parental responsibility could be taken to court and fined for each child who is not attending school regularly or who is persistently late. The Education Act 1996 states that all pupils should attend school regularly and punctually. 'If a child of compulsory school age, who is a registered pupil at a school fails to attend regularly at the school, his parent is guilty of an offence.'
